

Easter Message from Canon Benedict:

"Christians, to the paschal victim offer your thankful praises ... Christ indeed from death is risen, our new life obtaining." (Easter Sequence)

Each year we celebrate the Paschal events of salvation; it is not a mere remembrance of events of the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus, rather it is a reality in our lives; wherein we receive graces that flow from these events. St. Paul in his letter to the Colossians explain this more profoundly thus "... having forgiven us all our trespasses, by cancelling the record of debt that stood against us with its legal demands. This he set aside, nailing it to the cross. He disarmed the rulers and authorities and put them to open shame, by triumphing over them in him." (Col. 2:13-15).
