Prayer to St. Michael, Archangel

Fr Phillip writes... To see the sun makes us smile, its such a nice change from rain and cold.....however, many would rejoice over a bit of cool and a breeze at the moment! Even being at Mass is very warm, whereas usually we can enjoy the cool of the building, that is becoming challenging, especially if your wearing vestments! Maybe this weather is giving us a hint to be still, to find a little cool in front of a fan, drinking some iced water, and discovering the strength of reflective or mental prayer. Try sitting down with the conscious desire to spend time with God – bring your prayers before him for one minute, and then stop – be silent for four minutes..... and LISTEN! Make silence to her the voice of love embracing your soul.

Saint Bonaventure: was born in 1221 near Viterbo, Italy and named after his father, John of Fidenza. He died at Lyons in 1274 and his feast day is 15th July.

St. Bonaventure was especially noted for his spiritual writings and was called the Seraphic Doctor.



John joined the Franciscan order in 1243, taking the name Bonaventure. Noted for his learning and good judgement, Bonaventure was elected minister general of the Franciscans in 1257, at a time when the order was divided over how strictly it could observe St. Francis's commitment to poverty. He healed the division and thus came to be regarded as the order's second founder and the greatest friar minor after St. Francis of Assisi.

Pope Gregory X made him cardinal archbishop of Albano in May 1273. Bonaventure assisted in the preparations for a council at Lyons and was instrumental in reconciling the Eastern and Western divisions of the church. He died at Lyons in July 1274 and the reconciliation lasted for only another thirty years.

Bonaventure was a man of the highest intellectual attainments, and personal simplicity. He wrote the official Life of St. Francis of Assisi, and he himself travelled and preached the Franciscan way of life.

Pope Sixtus IV declared Bonaventure a saint in 1482, and in 1588 Pope Sixtus V designated him a Doctor of the Church. St Bonaventure – Pray for us!

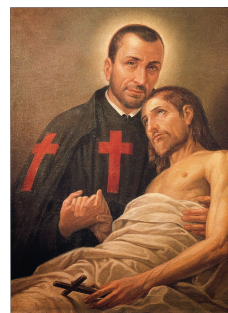
Pilgrimage - to the National Shrine of Our Lady of The Taper in Cardigan on the 18th July for Year 8's to year 13's

St. Camillus de Lellis : (25 May 1550 – 14 July 1614) was a Catholic priest from Italy who founded the Camillians, a religious order dedicated to the care of the sick. He was beatified by Pope Benedict XIV in the year 1742, and canonized by him four years later in 1746. In 1886, Pope Leo XIII proclaimed him patron of all hospitals and of the sick. In 1930, Pope Pius XI named him co-patron, with Saint John of God of nurses and nursing associations. His assistance is also invoked against gambling. His mortal remains are in the altar in the Church of St. Mary Magdalene in Rome, with the Cross which allegedly spoke to Camillus, and asked him, "Why are you afraid? Do you not realize that this is not your work but mine?" St Camillus—Pray for Us!

One thing all of us can do is give some help and guidance to our families, to take the guess work of what we would like for our own funerals.

These conversations are not something some families feel comfortable in having, so one option is to write down guidelines to help those we love plan our own funerals. There are funeral planning leaflets in the Church Porch, that will help you do exactly this. If this is something that might help you and your families, please take one and read it, and fill it in—then keep it in a safe place so it can be found when needed. Also, if you attend Mass, and your faith is important to you, please let your family know you would like a Requiem Mass. It would be tragic not to have this, if your loved ones do not practice, and yet you do. If you need any help, please talk to Fr Phillip, who will be happy to help you.
